


### SERVICE OF THE WORD

### FIRST READING


### Philippians 4:10-14

<sup>10</sup> I rejoice greatly in the Lord now that you have revived your concern for me once again. Actually, you were concerned, but you had no opportunity to show it. <sup>11</sup> I am not saying this because I lack anything; in fact, I have learned to be content in any circumstances in which I find myself. <sup>12</sup> I know what it is to live in humble circumstances, and I know what it is to have more than enough. I have learned the secret of being content in any and every situation, while being full or hungry, while having plenty or not enough. <sup>13</sup> I

can do all things through Christ, who strengthens me. <sup>14</sup> Nevertheless, you did well by becoming partners with me in my affliction.

Enter his gates with thanksgiving and his <u>courts</u> with praise;\* give thanks to him and <u>praise</u> his name.


For the LORD is good and his love endures for<u>ev</u>er;\* his faithfulness continues through all gener<u>a</u>tions.

GOSPEL Luke 17:11-19

<sup>11</sup> On another occasion, as Jesus was on his way to Jerusalem, he was passing along the border between Samaria and Galilee. <sup>12</sup> When he entered a certain village, ten men with leprosy met him. Standing at a distance, <sup>13</sup> they called out loudly, "Jesus, Master, have mercy on us!" <sup>14</sup> When he saw them, he said, "Go, show yourselves to the priests." As they went away they were cleansed. <sup>15</sup> One of them, when he saw that he was healed, turned back, glorifying God with a loud voice. <sup>16</sup> He fell on his face at Jesus' feet, thanking him. And he was a Samaritan. <sup>17</sup> Jesus responded, "Were not ten cleansed? Where are the other nine? <sup>18</sup> Was no one found to return and give glory to God except this foreigner?" <sup>19</sup> Then he said to him, "Get up and go your way. Your faith has saved you."



SERMON Psalm 100

#### THE FIRST ARTICLE OF THE APOSTLE'S CREED

C: I believe in God the Father almighty, maker of heaven and earth.

M: What does this mean?

C: I believe that God created me and all that exists, that he gave me my body and soul, eyes, ears, and all my members, my mind and all my abilities.

And I believe that God still preserves me by richly and daily providing clothing and shoes, food and drink, property and home, spouse and children, land, cattle and all I own, and all I need to keep my body and life. God also preserves me by defending me against all danger, guarding and protecting me from all evil. All this God does only because he is my good and merciful Father in heaven, and not because I have earned or deserved it. For all this I ought to thank and praise, to serve and obey him.

This is most certainly true.


#### **BLESSING**

## **Current Grants**

Domestic relief: providing disaster relief and medical assistance throughout the U.S. - \$432,695.

**Foreign relief:** providing disaster and financial relief to Albania, Asia, Bahamas, Bulgaria, China, Ethiopia, Hong Kong, India, Latin America, Malawi, Philippines, Thailand, Ukraine, Venezuela, Vietnam and Zambia, —\$249,990.

Included in funding for both the domestic and foreign relief grants \$172,003 was dispersed for Covid related issues.

**Humanitarian aid:** providing assistance for projects such as borehole drilling, health clinics, home based care, food assistance, and warm clothes for widows and orphans — \$455,919.

Home and World Mission fields receiving humanitarian aid grants: Central African Medical Mission, Malawi, Zambia, Albania, Bulgaria, Russia, Mexico, Venezuela, Asia, Indonesia, and several home mission congregations welcoming legal immigrants to their church and community.
